## Winter birds—1st—5th Feb 2021

Following all the cold weather we need to look after the birds in the winter time. Have a look in your garden, on your daily walk or in your outdoor space. See if there are any birds around and look after them. You could:-

- Maths—Count the number of birds that you see. You could make a tally chart to log each bird you spot.
- Understanding the World—Be creative and use your imagination
  - Draw or paint pictures of the birds you see.
  - Make some binoculars to see help you find the birds
  - Create songs or a story about the birds you see.
  - Make a bird feeder.
- ICT—Look the birds you see up on the internet to find out more about them.
- Den making—Make a bird hide so you can secretly spy on the birds.
- Physical development—Pretend to move like a bird,
- <u>Language development</u>—Describe in growing detail what you see. Use terms such as in the tree, on the log etc, biggest bird, smallest bird etc.
